## Principal's Notes ...

Dear Turrill Families,

Welcome back from our third intersession and spring break. Hopefully everyone is returning refreshed and ready for the final few months of the 2014/2015 school year. As we move into the final few months of the year, there will be a lot going on here at Turrill for our third through fifth grade students as they begin M-Step testing. As previously communicated, the M-Step is the new state testing that has replaced the MEAP test for third through fifth grade students. Previously our state assessments were a paper pencil assessments. The new M-Step test will be an online test. You will notice with the attached calendar that not all students will be testing at the same time and each grade level begins their testing on a different week. If you have a child in grades third through fifth, please utilize this calendar to ensure good attendance during the testing days and times. Please, also review the tips below to support your son or daughter during these testing times.

- Encourage your son or daughter to do their best.
- Keep a routine of an early bedtime during the testing times so students are coming to school ready.
- Attempt to limit or eliminate any absences the days of testing. We must stick to a strict testing window and when students are absent makeup tests must be arranged.
- Stay positive about the testing sessions.
- If students travel to CFI, have permission slips back to school prior to deadline.
- Remind your child that traveling to the CFI is not a fieldtrip but a place to focus and do their best.

In addition to the above suggestions, please review the testing calendar that is embedded into our monthly calendar. You will notice that with grades fourth and fifth students will be utilizing the CFI (Center for Innovation, old Lapeer West) for some or all of their testing sessions. Utilizing the CFI will allow our students to take the test all at the same time, as the CFI has 8 computer labs that will be used during this time. Students will be picked up from Turrill, travel to the CFI, test, and then be transported back. We are very fortunate in Lapeer to have the use of the CFI, as there are multiple advantages to having a central testing location.

If you have any questions regarding the upcoming M-Step testing, please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher or the school. If we have to make changes to the attached testing schedule please know a new calendar will be sent home.

## Turrill Parking Lot Reminders

At the start and end of the school day I realize that the parking lot can become congested but I wanted to send everyone a few reminders that will hopefully continue to improve the timely manner in which families can drop off and pick up their children.

- Please pull as far forward as possible when picking up or dropping off your child. Even if it's not directly in front of the door they enter into the building students can utilize the red line on the sidewalk and walk to the door that they enter.
- Please don't utilize multiple drop-off points for cars that have multiple children in them. Please drop-off all students at one location and allow older students to utilize the sidewalk and walk to the appropriate door or enter into the building and walk to their classroom inside the school.
- While traveling through the parking lot utilize a speed limit of 15mph. I realize that in the mornings we are all in a hurry to drop off and carry on with our day, but driving through the parking lot at excessive speeds causes concerns for all students and families.
- Only drop-off and pick-up students when your vehicle is parked next to the curb. Using the driving lane to pick up or drop-off is extremely dangerous.

**Allergies**

At Turrill we have a wide variety of students with allergies ranging from peanut, tree nut, walnuts, citrus, bee stings, eggs and many more. Each classroom that has students with various allergies will receive letters informing families of the allergies and what to avoid when sending treats, snacks and lunches to school. With these letters, we have designated areas of our school either nut free including classrooms, certain tables in the lunchroom, as well as grade levels. Turrill staff, families, and students appreciate all that you do to help keep our students safe and follow through with the various unique situations and requirements with our students.

**31A**

Turrill receives federal money to support the academics of at risk students in the form of 31A. With these additional funds, Turrill employs multiple interventionists as well as one support staff to meet the individual needs of our students. Students who are below grade level or meet a list of criteria are eligible to receive additional supports from staff. In addition to the current program offered, we are currently looking to start a before school reading intervention for students in grades third through fifth.
